Tuesday March 15th Missouri Presidential Preference Primary Certified Candidate List

Primary Ballot Placement: First day filers (12/1/15) selected a number by random drawing to determine their placement on the primary ballot. After the first day, all candidates are placed on the ballot in order of their filing.

Absentee Balloting is now open.

Please note: The March primary ballot will contain ONLY presidential candidates. Since there are no propositions or constitutional amendments on the ballot, voters must select a party preference when requesting a ballot.

B) 2016 *should be used* to continue to review League print/mailed publications with consideration and adoption of a complete communications plan: update and expansion to be initiated in 2017.

AUG. 2 STATE PRIMARY ELECTION

Missouri's state primary elections are held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in August of even-numbered years. Since Missouri has open primaries, every eligible registered voter may select the party ballot of their choice. However, primary voters may select only one party's ballot. Voters who do not wish to give a political party preference may request an issues-only ballot, if one is available in that particular jurisdiction.

The filing period for the state primary election is from Feb. 23 to March 29.

**MISSOURI Initiative Petitions:
2016 Initiative Petitions
Open for Public Comment**

Public comment is currently open for initiative petitions. Note that the text of these petitions may not constitute the full and correct text as required under Section 116.050, RSMo. Before circulating a petition for signatures, state law requires that groups must first have the form of their petition approved by the secretary of state's office. The office then has 23 days after the form of the petition is approved to draft ballot summary language. During this time, the office will review all comments.

The comment period will be open for a minimum of 30 days. If you are interested in conveying your thoughts as to these initiative petitions, please contact the Secretary of State's office by:

ST. LOUIS COUNTY - WIDE VOTE- requires simple majority - Wording

PROPOSITION B "Shall St. Louis County continue applying and collecting the local sales tax on the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats and outboard motors that were purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri dealer?"

Rejection of this measure will result in a reduction of local revenue to provide vital services for St. Louis County and it will place Missouri dealers of motor vehicles, outboard motors, boats and trailers at a competitive disadvantage to non-Missouri dealers of motor vehicles, outboard motors, boats and trailers." **YES NO**

Background: Missouri loses sales tax because of out of state purchases (see wording). The goal of proposal: to encourage buying within the state. Impact on sales tax receipts.

MSD BOND ELECTION

PROPOSITION S (wording)

"Shall the Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District (MSD) impose a Stormwater Operations and Maintenance property tax upon all real and tangible personal property within the district at a rate of not more than Ten Cents (\$0.10) per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) assessed valuation for the purpose of providing revenue for the operations of the district stormwater utility, including stormwater system operation and maintenance, rehabilitation and limited construction of infrastructure and other capital improvements, and an operating reserve?"

If this proposition is approved, MSD will repeal (a) the existing stormwater operations and maintenance property tax of approximately Seven Cents (\$0.07) per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) assessed valuation that is imposed on property within the original boundaries of MSD, as defined in the MSD Charter, and within the annexed areas described in MSD Ordinance No. 3753, and (b) the existing monthly 24-Cent or 18-Cent stormwater service charge that is imposed on each MSD customer account.

As a result, a uniform districtwide stormwater revenue system for operations, maintenance, and limited capital improvements will be in place."

Presently stormwater services are financed by several fees and charges which differ depending on where the property is located.

In the area annexed in 1977, there is no income source to finance needed services.

The proposition will provide for a uniform source of revenue throughout the District allowing the District to provide more comprehensive stormwater services.

MSD BOND ELECTION

PROPOSITION Y (wording)

"To comply with federal and state clean water requirements, shall The Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District (MSD) issue its sewer revenue bonds in the amount of Nine Hundred Million Dollars (\$900,000,000.00) for the purpose of designing, constructing, improving, renovating, repairing, replacing and equipping new and existing MSD sewer and drainage facilities and systems, including sewage treatment and disposal plants, sanitary sewers, and acquisition of easements and real property related thereto, the cost of operation and maintenance of said facilities and systems and the principal of and interest on said revenue bonds to be payable solely from the revenues derived by MSD from the operation of its wastewater sewer system, including all future extensions and improvements thereto?"

4/7 majority required.

The bond issue would enable MSD to continue progress on the multi-decade \$4.7 billion program to meet the terms of a consent decree reached with the EPA and the Missouri Coalition for the Environment. **If the proposition passes,** the average single family wastewater bill would be \$40.72 in fiscal year (FY) 2016 rising to \$60.86 in FY2020. **If the proposition fails,** funding would be on a cash (pay-go) basis and the bill would be \$40.72 in FY2016 to \$96.01 in FY 2020.

A yes vote would authorize MSD to issue the bonds.

A no vote means that funding would be on a cash basis.
